

## Prayers for Advent

Advent begins on the fourth Sunday (December 3) before Christmas and ends on Christmas Eve (December 24). Marked by a spirit of anticipation, this joyous journey prepares our hearts to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. In the midst of the frenetic holiday preparations, hopefully you can find time to make this Advent season even more meaningful by engaging in some of the ancient traditions and activities listed below:

1. Create an Advent wreath. Read Scripture, pray, and sing carols before lighting each candle.
2. Count down the days to Christmas with an Advent calendar featuring daily Bible verses.
3. Set up a crèche (nativity scene). Wait until Christmas Eve to place the baby Jesus in the manger.
4. Add straw to a life-size manger every time a family member does a good deed so that the baby Jesus will have a soft bed.
5. Make a Jesse tree. Decorate it with symbols or ornaments depicting Jesus' ancestry or the Old Testament.
6. Attend a pageant, watch seasonal specials, bake cookies, or read Christmas stories with family or friends.
7. Go caroling at a nursing home, volunteer at a shelter or food pantry, or contribute to a worthy cause.
8. Perform secret acts of kindness.
9. Visit someone who is mourning the loss of a loved one or coping with divorce, job loss, or sickness.
10. Focus on inward disciplines such as meditation, prayer, fasting, and Bible study.
11. Read the Christmas story (Luke 2:1-20) on Christmas Eve.
12. Hold a Birthday Party for Jesus, replete with storytelling, singing, and a cake.
